The lectures in the following list are offered mainly in Japanese, but with the additional use of English language for better understanding. For the students of beginner level of Japanese from overseas, this list provides a better guide for choosing some lectures prepared for you. Some Japanese students also attend these lectures to have some chance to communicate with you using English language in the class and for your better understanding.

In this lecture, we will discuss the topics of current medical care system. Modern medicine has developed to be a major medical service in most of the developed countries whereas many problems are arising with the progress of medicine. We also discuss the effect of the traditional medicine and current status of it in each country.			
<b>Active learning for globalization by cross-cultural communications</b> (異文化交流から学ぶグローバル化) / Makoto Ohashi	10510	Spring Wed 3-4	N3
This lecture is focused on the cross-cultural communications between Japanese students and foreign students. In each lecture, we will have cross cultural talking on the local culture, language, and the local community. People from the local community also join this class. This lecture class will be sometimes joined to another class for foreign students and will do cooperative activities. Peer learning for learning foreign cultures will also be done for making a deeper understanding of foreign cultures.			
<b>Cultural studies for the global society</b> (グローバル社会に必要な 教養とは何か) / Makoto Ohashi	10512	Spring Wed 9-10	N3
This lecture is the joint class for citizens who are interested in the contribution to the university education for developing the new style of Andragogy vs Pedagogy relationship on cultural and general education in universities. We would like to discuss the innovation for university education for globalizing society, current social problems worldwide, and current situation of social problems in the local society. People from the local society or high school students will join this class.

This lecture will be held in order to study with foreign students and citizens. Understanding of the local cultures and general Japanese cultures is the main purpose of this lecture. The peer learning activity with foreign students is the basic style of this lecture. During the process of this lecture, students will improve their ability of cross-cultural communications with foreign students. Easy physical exercises will be done at the opening of the class for mutual understanding of local cultures.			
<b>Cross-cultural communication for global society I - Studies for multicultural symbiotic society -</b> (グローバル社会に必要な異文化理解のためにI—多文化共生社会を考える—) / Makoto Ohashi, Takahito Saito	90501	May-Sept. Intensive	N5
This lecture will be held in order to study in foreign universities as the short visit students (Thailand, Laos, or Mongolia). We will study the cultural background and language of the country where we will visit. We also discuss the content of the presentation or cultural exchange program that will be done in the foreign university.			
<b>Global communication - volunteer experience in local community -</b> / Makoto Ohashi, Takahito Saito, Takanori Satoh, Takashi Yamashiro	90502	June-Aug. Intensive	N5
This lecture will be held in order to understand the famous local cultures in Tokushima and in other part of Japan by fundamental studies and practical studies. The most important purpose of this lecture is to improve the ability of cross-cultural communications with foreign students. During the process of cultural studies, you should have your own opinions on the typical features of your own cultures in terms of comparison with other cultures.			
<b>Global Communication - Peer Learning on Science -</b> / Takahito Saito	20508	Fall-Winter Tue 1-2	N5
The purpose of this lecture is to understand the scientific thinking. Some experiments will be performed to verify your own hypothesis. For many experiments, scientific subjects in playing will be picked up such as paper plane, boomerang, top-spinning. To improve the scientific communication, some competitions of handicrafts will also be held.

This lecture is also intended to understand their own traditional cultures in relation with other cultures. Such a experience of the peer learning with Japanese students will be the first step for the understanding of the Japanese culture in many fields.			
<b>Medical care system of the local community in the global society</b> (グローバル化時代の地域医療を考える) / Makoto Ohashi	20501	Fall-Winter Mon 3-4	N4
This lecture is aimed to consider about the future system for the health care in the local community. Western medical care system has been developed employing highly advanced molecular and cellular biology. Although it is expected to contribute to the creation of new business, the improvement of the medical care system is not promised in the local community. We would like to discuss the sustainable medical care system, agriculture and safety of the daily foods in the local community.			
<b>Global society and cross - cultural communications - (グローバル社会と異文化コミュニケーション)</b> / Makoto Ohashi	20505	Fall-Winter Mon 9-10	N4
Cross-cultural communication for understanding of different standpoint of view is the main purpose of this lecture. In each time of the class, we will make some groups for discussion on some topics with Japanese students, foreign students, and citizens from the local community. This lecture is intended to study the significance of volunteer activity in the local community. In each lecture, active volunteer leaders will give the report on their activities for the development of local community social capital. Furthermore, some volunteer activity in the local community will be introduced for your volunteer experience in the local community.

An example of the program is as follows; the production of pottery art-crafts for tea ceremony is the first step of the creative work. Next, we will have tea ceremony using the pottery art-craft product for understanding the traditional Japanese culture. Finally, we would study the history of the tea ceremony with the peer learner.
